

Urgent Need of Thai Fishing Supply Chain Transparency (2/2)



- California Supply Chain Transparency Act -> supply chain transparency
- Now → UK Slavery Act → supply chain transparency

Now

- upcoming ➤ U.S. Executive Order 13627 Model Compliance for Federal contractors/supplier/supplier of supplier → import ban
- U.S. Tariff Reauthorization Bill Elimination of consumptive Demand Exception → import ban on individual company that its supply chain tainted by forced labor

'Now' California Supply Chain Transparency Act



- requires that manufacturers and retailers with over \$100 post a disclosure statement of steps they have taken to prevent and address human trafficking in their supply chains.
- Engages in **verification of product supply chains** to evaluate and address risks of human trafficking and slavery. third party verification?
- Conducts audits of suppliers to evaluate supplier compliance with company standards for trafficking and slavery in supply chains. independent and unannounced audit?
- Requires **direct suppliers** to certify that materials incorporated into the product **comply with the laws regarding slavery and human trafficking**
- Maintains internal accountability standards and procedures for employees or contractors failing to meet company standards regarding slavery and trafficking.
- Provides company employees and management training on human trafficking and slavery, particularly with respect to mitigating risks within the supply chains of products.

Violation of California Supply Chain Transparency Act

Class Action Case: Seeking Reliefs

"Defendants' practices are fraudulent in that Defendant Costco affirmatively represents that it enforces its standards to prohibit the use of slave labor and it fails to identify the fact that the frozen Thai prawns it is selling is produced using slave labor.


UK Slavery Act - Supply Chain Transparency

Executive Order 13627

 September 2012 - Executive Order 13627: "Strengthen Protections Against Trafficking in Persons in Federal Contracts"

The 1930 Tariff Act – put import ban on goods/commodities produced with forced, coerced or indentured child or adult labor – <u>except</u> when domestic supply was insufficient to meet consumer demand. (called "consumptive demand exception") TLCS

The 1930 Tariff Act, if amended, - any consumer can file requests at U.S. Customs and Border Protection **to prohibit imports** of goods produced under abusive labor conditions






